




Nearly 80% of greenhouse gas emissions in Arlington come from residential buildings and passenger vehicles

Percent of Total Community-Wide Emissions by Subsector (2017)



Net Zero Buildings in Arlington

- 2021 Net Zero Action Plan priority area
- All 12,000 buildings in Arlington must be net zero buildings by 2050
- Must convert at least one building per day, or more than 400 buildings per year for 30 years
- HeatSmart Arlington-Winchester Campaign 2018-2020: 170 contracts signed in Arlington for clean heating and cooling technologies

- Analysis paralysis






Electrify Arlington is...

Income Eligible Program

If you live in a single family home or 2-4 unit building and you qualify as low-income,* you may be eligible for energy-saving upgrades that can lower your monthly energy bills and make your home more comfortable at no cost. Property owners may also be eligible based on their, or theirs tenants' income.

- No-cost heat pump consultations with volunteer residents
- Coaches trained by Abode Energy Management, training funded by the Town

Coaching Process

- 1. Resident fills out intake form, info entered into CRM
- 2. Volunteer shares **Homeowner Questionnaire and Liability Waiver** with resident
- 3. Volunteer matches resident with Coach
- 4. **Coach consults with resident** (virtually / in person), also by email, initial session, in ongoing basis as needed
- 5. Resident schedules **Mass Save audit** (if not complete)
- Resident obtains and reviews three quotes with Coach / Abode as needed
- 7. Coaches have **monthly check-ins** to swap notes, troubleshoot

How we got here

How we're doing so far...

Since November 2022 launch...

- 10 events, classes, workshops held
- 4 coaches trained, 3 new coaches to be trained this summer
- 107 resident requests for coaches, 53 residents matched
- 19 residents "completed" work with coach
- 13 residents have either installed heat pumps or are waiting for the contractor to finish the installation
- \$50,000 in funding for Electrify Arlington through 2024
- Hiring an Energy Advocate for 12-15 hours / week

- Funding Sources
 - Mass Save Education Grant
 - Mass Save Community First Partnership
 - Energy Efficiency & Conservation Block Grant program
 - Green Communities competitive grants (specially-eligible communities)
 - Many other federal grants...!

Challenges to anticipate

- Demands of program management: intake, marketing, volunteers
- Installer selection learning curves, market lag
- Incentive structures / program pathways

- Start small
- Focus on relationships
- Get creative and collaborative
- Make connections to related topics
