APPLIANCE EFFICIENCY REGULATIONS FOR PASADENA

Appliance standards set minimum efficiency standards for energy and water using products. Pasadena adopted appliance standards through the Energy Efficiency Forever Act on 1/31/2021 which set requirements for 5 new products. Regulated products manufactured on or after 1/31/2022 will need to meet the states' appliance efficiency regulations, which involves meeting the performance, testing, marking and certification requirements. Each product will need to be certified to one of the following databases in order to be legally sold or offered for sale in the state:

- State Appliance Standards Database (SASD) [hyperlink]
- Modernized Appliance Efficiency Database System (MAEDbS)

Retailers, distributors, and installers of the following products can visit these databases to ensure your offerings are in compliance with these new energy efficiency regulations.
