Overview - Phase 1 and 2

Phase 1: Survey of practices in Northeast and mid-Atlantic states (Oct 2013 Final Report) with review of:

- State Policy Drivers (high level)
- Screening Tests & Application Practices
- Benefits & Costs
- Other Program Impacts (OPIs)
- Recommendations

Phase 2: Develop C-E Screening Guidelines based on findings from survey of practices

Participating States: CT, DC, DE, MA, NH, NY, RI, VT

Contractor: Synapse Energy Economics

COST-EFFECTIVENESS SCREENING GUIDELINES

Purpose and Application



Purpose:

- 1. Establishes overarching principles that states should consider using in reviewing their EE screening practices.
- 2. Provides specific guidance on challenging elements of C-E screening, as prioritized by Forum members.

Application:

- 1. Does not prescribe any one C-E screening test, focuses on considerations guided by the overarching principles.
- 2. Relevance or application of Guidelines will vary from state to state depending on state's current screening practices, where some states are already largely aligned with the overarching principles and Guidelines.
- 3. Start with utility cost test as foundation and build upon that depending on state energy policies and what's in the public interest

COST-EFFECTIVENESS SCREENING GUIDELINES

Scope



Key principles *

- Align C-E screening with state energy policies and what is in the public interest
- Ensure symmetry of relevant costs and benefits
- Account for relevant hard-to-quantify benefits, where applicable
- Provide for transparency of C-E testing practices

COST-EFFECTIVENESS SCREENING GUIDELINES Scope (2)



Guidance on specific issues

- Aligning screening practices with state energy policies Accounting for Non-Energy Impacts (NEIs) Impacts/OPIs, discount rate, accounting for risk)
- Accounting for environmental compliance costs
- Accounting for risk and use of discount rates
- Sample template for documenting C-E assumptions

State Use and Implementation



Forum Guidelines adopted by Steering Committee in November 2014, whereby...

The Steering Committee* recommends that the proposed Forum Cost-Effectiveness Screening Guidelines be adopted as a Forum product, whereby such adoption indicates the states' intent to encourage the consideration, use and reference of the Guidelines in their respective state.
